## **Highlights from the Meeting**

President Rick Stumpf welcomed everyone to the 1,058<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Liebling Pleasure Society on Sunday, October 3, 2021.

Rick thanked the Hospitality Committee, Vicky Stumpf and Nancy Holl, for setting up the luncheon and for providing snacks and he thanked other members who brought snacks. Rick also thanked the Bar Committee, George & Joe Schubkegel, and Jim Wagner. The luncheon was sponsored by Roger & Cheryl Falk, and the cake was sponsored by Elaine & Keith Grossich in celebration of their anniversary.

The September minutes taken by Katie Amundsen were read by Mary Wagner and approved. Johanna Swiontek read the Financial Report and it was approved. Rick thanked Johanna and welcomed her back to the meetings since she was unable to attend for a couple of months.

Rick stated that the Club received a thank you letter from the CSA Fraternal Life In Lombard for donating the amber pill bottles. He said that by donating these bottles we are helping the

environment and also helping third world countries.

Update on the E-book: some additional changes need to be made on the Lieblinger Cookbook E-book and we hope to have the E-book completed by the Christmas Party.

Rick withdrew all of the advertising for our Kirchweih and contacted various Clubs to inform them of the postponement. Rick said that he would also put a note on the front gate on the day of the Kirchweih to advise anyone who may have missed the cancellation notice.

A discussion was held regarding the band, Paloma. Members were informed by Elaine Grossich that the band was offered a job in June to play for a two day fest out of town the same weekend of our Kirchweih. At that time, the band turned down that job because of the booking for our Kirchweih. In order to stay in good standing with Paloma, a Motion was made and passed to compensate Paloma for their loss of revenue for the day of our Kirchweih.

The details for our Christmas Party coming up on December 5<sup>th</sup> at Manzo's Banquets were discussed. Rick will be contacting Manzo's and will report back to members at the next meeting any changes in the minimum number of people the Club has to guarantee and the pricing for adults and children; as well as their mask requirements.

Rick reminded members that our November meeting is also our Election meeting. He also stated that Johanna Swiontek will not be accepting the office of Financial Secretary for next year so that position will need to be filled. Also, he welcomed members to come and join a Committee.

John Schaefer said that he received a call from Konrad Schmidt. Mr. Schmidt wants to remind members that September 22th was the 77<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the day Lieblingers had to flee Liebling. Mr. Schmidt told John that 2,158 people had left that day. Elaine Grossich said that she recorded Mr. Schmidt's personal account that he shared with members a number of years ago and that we should have the recording transcribed and share with all members of the Club.

In honor of the 77<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the fleeing from Liebling, I would like to share the personal account from the commemorative book entitled "Schun vun weidm hot mr die Kerich gsieh" about the Lieblinger experience in Austria after the Flucht.

Dorothy Nagelbach emailed me a copy to share with members and told me that she and her sister, Veronika, translated to English this chapter from their Uncle Adam's book. This translated chapter from Adam Nagelbach's book will be emailed separately with this newsletter since it is quite lengthy. Through the years, I have listened to various personal accounts of the day that Lieblingers had to flee Liebling, but I was told very little about what happened once Liebligers arrived in Austria. I know you will be as enlightened as I was. Bettie
