Highlights from the September Meeting

The 1,079th meeting was held on September 10, 2023.

A Moment of Silence was held for Rick Amundsen, husband of 2nd Vice President, Katie Amundsen, and for Johanna Spang who passed away on Saturday, September 9th. Our deepest condolences to Katie and her family and to Johanna Spang's family.

The sponsors for the luncheon and cake were Nancy and Mike Holl in celebration of their 37-year anniversary and Vicky and Rick Stumpf in celebration of their 40-year anniversary.

Rick thanked the Hospitality Committee: Nancy Holl, Vicky Stumpf, Christy Schubkegel for preparing and setting up the luncheon and thanked Natalie Schubkegel for helping today. Rick thanked the Bar Committee, Joe and George Schubkegel and Roger Falk. Vicky Stumpf and Nancy Holl were thanked for providing snacks and Joe Schubkegel for the sausage appetizers.

The Minutes were read by Heidi Atkinson and Rick made one correction; that Bonnie Goerlich was not a new member but a re-instated member to the club. The Minutes were corrected and approved. Liz Steeb gave the Financial Report and was approved.

Rick Stumpf received a letter from the CSA Fraternal Life in Lombard thanking members for their collection and donation of empty, and clean amber pill bottles which are recycled and used in third world countries.

A Motion was made, seconded, voted, and passed to continue the sponsorships for the Kirchweih. The Platinum level is \$100, Gold level is \$50, and the Silver level is \$25. There will be a printed card on each table listing the name of the Sponsors.

Rick informed members that Elaine Grossich and Joe and George Schubkegel are preparing and working on the food service for the Kirchweih.

The Donauschwaben contract for the hall on Friday night to prepare food and Saturday for the Kirchweih was sent to Rick and signed. There are 2 minor changes to the contract, a small increase for the linens of \$50 and the use of the hall on Friday night and for the bartenders of \$50. The time for members to come to the hall to prepare food on Friday night will be determined at the October 1st meeting.

This year, Keith Grossich, John Schaefer, and Roger Falk will greet and check in members and guests at the front table. Karen and Mark Rill, and Christy Schubkegel will coordinate the Grosse marchers. Katie Naurath and Lauren Lehnhardt will coordinate the Kleine Marchers.

Heidi Atkinson said anyone wishing to march should make sure they are on the sign-up sheet. If someone wants to march but does not have a partner; they should still sign up in case someone else is looking for a partner.

Heidi has the club's Tracht pieces and if anyone needs to borrow an item, they should contact her. Heidi will have the Tracht items available at the October 1st meeting.

Members are needed to volunteer to serve at the dessert table and take tickets and we also need ticket takers at the food line. We also need volunteers at the end of the night to help put away chairs, etc.

The PA system and computer system will be set up to distribute the prizes. It was determined that no tickets will be sold at the raffle table until after the marchers have finished selling all their tickets. A last call to buy tickets will be made before winners are chosen and can be purchased at the raffle table. Anyone donating a completed raffle basket should bring it to the October 1st meeting.

The entry fee for the Kirchweih on October 14th is \$15 and the price of the dinner will remain the same as last year despite the increase in food prices. The dinner ticket is \$15, the sandwich ticket is \$10, the dessert is \$4, and pretzels are \$3.

This project had its beginning at last year's Kirchweih when our daughter, Erika, was asked at the last minute to coordinate the Grosse marchers. She was given brief verbal directions and had no notes, so she relied on her past experiences. On our drive home Rick, Erika, and I shared our stories of the events of the happy evening as we always had for so many years. Erika stressed to us that her generation was ready to assume leadership responsibilities at the Kirchweih, but they needed guidance and details of how to carry on our traditions. I promised that I would work to make that happen, and together with our board, created this project.

Over the next eight months as we collaborated, wrote sections, presented workshops, and worked hard to create a helpful guide, I never suspected that Rick and I would be the first to relinquish our duties for the 2023 Kirchweih. This year after carrying the flag for 52 years, my husband will not be in the first Aufmarsch, nor in the kitchen. This year after attending every Kirchweih from 1950-2022 and being a volunteer or participant, I will not be there either. Our many tasks are being filled and completed by the next generation, and I am very grateful. There is no greater honor than to pass our work on to the future, that's what Kerweih 101 was all about. Our beloved club is in good hands!

Thank you to Karen and Mark Rill, Roger Falk, Kate Naurath, Lauren Lehnhardt, and Christy Schubkegel for stepping forward, and to Rick Stumpf, John Schaefer, Heidi Atkinson, Liz Steeb, and Mary Wagner for their leadership. I know that everyone in the club will support their work and efforts to make this Kirchweih a big success. Remember to register your marchers the week before the Kirchweih, bring extra hats, starch the blouses until they're like a board, be patient, kind, and thank our volunteers.

Proper Attire for the Kirchweih Marchers

The girls wear the 5-piece traditional Lieblinger Tracht; pleated overskirt, pleated underskirts, blue satin apron with black lace, white blouse with pleated short sleeves, Halstuch. For the Grosse Marchers, no headpieces such as flowers, long ribbons, or big bows. Boys wear long pants, a solid color shirt, a Kirchweih hat with a red satin ribbon and flowers on the left side. Optional pieces include vest, sweater, or blazer/suit jacket.
