The 1,069<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Liebling Pleasure Society was held on October 2, 2022.

Rick thanked the Hospitality Committee, Nancy Holl and Vicky Stumpf. He also thanked the Bar Committee serving members, George Schubkegel and John Geringer. The luncheon was sponsored by Kim & Guenther Schmidt in celebration of Kim's birthday and the cake was sponsored by Roger & Cheryl Falk. Rick also thanked members for all the snacks prepared and donated.

The Minutes of the September meeting were read by Rick Stumpf and were approved. The Financial Report was given by Heidi Atkinson and was approved
