Rezept des Monats (Recipe of the Month)

Thanks to the preview of fall weather that we were treated to, I was in the mood for soup! I adore Autumn and soup season, so when I was flipping through the cookbook, this recipe caught my eye. It's not something I have ever had but I had all the ingredients on-hand, so I was able to cook up this flavorful, cozy dish!



Dumpling Goulash (Goulash Knödel)

Ingredients

Goulash:

1 large onion, chopped 4 c water (approximate - enough to cover ingredients)

3 T Crisco (or oil) 1 bay leaf

3 potatoes, sliced salt (to taste - I used about a teaspoon)

1 smoked sausage, sliced paprika (to taste - I used about two teaspoons)

Dumplings:

2 eggs dash salt flour (about 1 cup) 1-2 tsp water

- Saute onion in Crisco/oil in a medium saucepan.
- Add remaining ingredients (except for dumplings) and add enough water to cover. Simmer until potatoes are almost done.
- Beat eggs and flour until thick (I used about 1 cup of flour... my best guess!). Add salt to taste (personally used 1 teaspoon) and water. Mix well.
- Add dumplings by spooning them into the saucepan and simmer until dumplings are done. TIP: If you dip your spoon into the hot soup before scooping up a bit of the batter, it will slide right off your spoon!

Did you know? The word Kirchweih means "church celebration". We are celebrating the founding of the Lutheran church in Liebling. It was built in 1828!
