Heidi reported on the discussions she's had with Manzo's banquet hall regarding our Christmas party for this year. There was a minor price hike which wasn't unexpected due to the economy. She will be checking back with them regarding holiday decor. The menu for the party will be discussed later, but some suggestions were made. George made a motion to pay the deposit with a second from Joe.

An update regarding our tax exempt filing status was also given by Heidi... We are waiting on a response from the State of Illinois.

Rick received an update on the Liebling cemeteries (noted 1 year and 22 days after original inquiry). An organization was formed separate from the church to handle regular upkeep of both the East and West cemeteries from April-October. This adds up to about 1500 Euros for both per year. The restoration costs are estimated at 9,000 euros for the East cemetery and 12,000 for the West. 7,000 euros have been raised so far.



The facilities manager of the Donauschwaben hall reached out to Rick asking if our June meeting could be rescheduled as they have a member that would like to rent the hall for the day. The currently scheduled do



would like to rent the hall for the same day. The currently scheduled date is June 8th; the dates suggested were the day before (Saturday June 7th) or the following Sunday the 15th, which is Father's Day.

After much discussion, Karen made the motion that we request to move to June 1st, but if not, to decline to reschedule. Tom seconded. An addendum to that motion was made by Stephanie, suggesting that if that the 1st is not available, we skip the June meeting entirely. Jen seconded the amendment and the motion carried. Rick will get back to the Donauschwaben and will report back next meeting. *(It has been determined that there will be NO CHANGE to our original June 8th meeting date).* 

Karen noted that she received dues for Mikayla Steeb, but that she was not a registered member. Rick conceded to go back to new membership for Liz and Mikayla was voted in so that her dues could be processed. This led to discussion about the age that children could become members, which is 16 years old.



Karen also made note that she has not received membership dues from quite a lot of our members. As this is April, we are now at the point where if dues are not received, people will be removed from our membership list. An estimated half of our membership are now in arrears. #### Süsskraut

This recipe was submitted by Angie and Adam in honor of Eva Schmidt who shared it with them.

#### Ingredients

half of a cabbage, diced 3 or 4 potatoes, diced (Angie suggests yellow potatoes) bouillon soup cube or powder (Angie uses Vegeta powder) 1 cup water pinch of salt

Combine all ingredients in a pot and cook until soft, then mash. If desired, you can drain off some of the water first so that the finished product isn't as thin.



*Editor's note:* I'd never had this before to my knowledge, but I needed a photo, so... I used white potatoes with the peels on (because I'm lazy like that) and chicken Better than Bouillon (that's what I've got). It was quite yummy!

Coloring and activity books - along with crayons, markers, and colored pencils - were provided and the children quickly found them! (below)


