Highlights - March Meeting

The 1,084th meeting was held on March 3, 2024.

The luncheon was sponsored by Cheryl and Roger Falk in celebration of their birthdays. The menu for the March meeting was broasted and fried chicken which was enjoyed by members. Thank you to all the members who made and brought appetizers, side dishes and desserts-all were delicious! A big thank you to the Hospitality Committee: Nancy Holl, Elaine Grossich, Christy Schubkegel and Vicky Stumpf for planning, and preparing the luncheon. The Hospitality Committee is planning a brunch for the April meeting. A sign-up sheet was at the front desk to sponsor the luncheon for the April meeting.

Rick Stumpf thanked the Bar Committee: Joe and George Schubkegel, Roger Falk, and Adam Helwich for serving beverages at the meeting. Also, a shout-out to bartender-emeritus, Jim Wagner, for a special appearance.

The Minutes of the February meeting was read by Stephanie Snyder and were approved as read.

The Financial Report was presented by Liz Steeb and approved.

Heidi Atkinson announced that she is working on the taxexempt status for the club.

Rick said that he has heard from the Liebling church Pastor, Pastor Sinn, and Waltraut Eberle about their planned visit to the club. Pasto Sinn cannot get a passport in time to visit the club in July.

We are still looking to members to provide requests for Tracht pieces before we contact the Montreal Lieblinger Club to acquire pieces their members no longer need. Katie Amundsen volunteered to help acquire these Tracht pieces from Montreal.

A question was posed at the meeting to move the Kirchweih to November. A discussion followed and it was determined that November would be a bad month because of the following events in November: Karlsdorfer Kirchweih, Schlachtfest, and Thanksgiving. It was suggested that to keep the Kirchweih costs manageable we set the date and book out two years ahead.

In new business- there was an extended discussion about supporting a Germany-based organization who plans on the cemetery restoration in Liebling and if the club should help fund the restoration and/or maintenance of the cemetery and/or to help fund the restoration of the Liebling church. Rick said that Waltraut said, as quoted in the Ründschreiben, "175 thousand Euros was needed for the Church interior and 130 K Euros was needed for the exterior". Mary Wagner made an impassioned plea to save the cemetery for future generations.

It was also brought up that the church is important because the Liebling church has historical records of Lieblingers. There was a lot of discussion about tracking the money donated. The topic was unresolved, and the discussion ended with Rick saying he was going to look into the church's plan for restoration and maintenance. The last question posed by Rick was now that Pastor Sinn is not coming in July, what should the club do with the bookmarks/ornaments that were going to be given to Pastor Sinn?

It was announced that Bunco and cards would be played after the meeting. Bunco would be limited to just six games.

Katie Amundsen read the names of members celebrating birthdays and anniversaries in March and presented the donate **items**.
